#### **SPEEDING:**

**The SID has been deployed in several areas within Hughenden Valley and Great Kingshill.**

The Hughenden valley results have shown that at the times between 0830 and 0915, traffic flow was moderate with an average road speed of 34MPH. Both directions were monitored. A total of 490 vehicles were checked.

Stag Lane, Great Kingshill was checked around 1330hrs with a total of 89 vehicles being checked and the average speed was 30 MPH

T-SID has been approved for 3 deployments in the near future, Widmer End, Naphill and Hughenden Valley. Bucks Highways will position them in strategic positions that have previously been highlighted as hotspot areas for excess speed.

Five dates have been set for the **March** period, the locations are yet to be established but each ward will have at least 1 SID deployment over the period. If you are interested in seeing how the device works or you are interested in becoming involved in the process please contact Natalie HALL or Lee Turnham at the above address or e-mail. We will then be able to inform you of the location and time that is appropriate to your ward.

#### **LITTER:**

The first LITTER PICK of the year has taken place. Cryers Hill was the targeted area, there were a few people who turned out, retrieving several black bags of litter. There were also items that were way too big to be put in bags, such as OLD TYRES and PLASTIC PIPING.

The area looks noticeably cleaner. It will now be easier to pick the odd piece of discarded litter.

If you have a litter problem, please let the team know and we will try to co-ordinate a litter pick in your area.

#### **PARKING:**

Great Kingshill School parking issues have been raised again, with the report of vehicles parking on Private driveways. Photographs have been taken. Individuals have been seen in person by police officers. There was also one vehicle, which was not insured. Working with the Roads policing unit from Amersham this vehicle was stopped and was seized under section 165 of the Road Traffic Act. Please note that the individual was taking their children to school in a vehicle with NO insurance. Any vehicle without insurance will be seized under this legislation.

The grass verge down the hill on the opposite side of the school is now in a sorry state, the mud is increasing day by day. It has been discussed and a possible way forward is to place large tree trunks on the area and stop parking completely. This will be raised at the next Parish meeting.

Widmer End School has parents who will not listen to advice on suitable parking. This has caused problems with residents as well as other law abiding parents. The Roads Policing unit has been informed and will provide future assistance to officers on foot.

One member of the public has already been spoken to, in relation to the vehicle's condition. They are to be subjected to future enforcement, should the vehicle be used with the fault still apparent.

#### WHEELIE BIN STICKERS;

The Great Kingshill residents association have purchased a number of the 30MPH stickers for your bins. Should you require these please contact your local residents association for prices etc.

#### The crime mapping website;

This has caused great concern for some residents in the Widmer End area. The statistics that are shown on the website do not show the true picture. The crimes reported show that there were 8 Burglaries on one street. However this is not true, there was 8 Thefts but were recorded as Burglary Non Dwellings, thus the confusion. There was a letter drop, with a statement from the Inspector, about the recordings. A copy of which is included at the end of this newsletter.

I would like to introduce myself as the Sector Inspector responsible for neighbourhood policing in your area.

In response to a recent article in the press where Primrose Hill was listed as the street with the tenth highest amount of burglaries in the country, I would like to reassure residents that this isn't the case and they are still living in a very safe location.

The figures that were published weren't put into any context and I would like to make it clear that there has not been a burglary to any house in Primrose Hill since 2009. The data that the papers used is from a single occasion when overnight on 26 to 27 December last year eight empty caravans at a farm in Primrose Hill were broken into.

I would still encourage residents to be vigilant and ensure that they have taken all necessary security precautions for their houses so that way we can continue to keep Primrose Hill the safe location that it is
